The Deter Young off shore race to Galveston is scheduled for May 24th, 25th and 26th.

HOUSE and GROUNDS - John Ardion assisted Butch Neely back flushing the showers in the men's room. Then, Butch Neely assisted John Ardion trim the palms away from the roof. Looking at fixing the laboratories. Motion made by Russ Myers to budget \$600 for the laboratories seconded by Ted Mahavier. Discussion- they will try to be fixed for less. Motion passed.

PIC REPORT –. 200ft fishing pier at end of Blvd is complete and wheelchair accessible. Marina Re-Grand opening will be May 16th in the afternoon according to Mayor Prince's schedule. They will have diesel fuel and unleaded non –ethanol gasoline pumps up and working by mid-May. They are still negotiating with the

Renaissance Group to extend their lease on the Island. They announced the city attorney assigned the negotiations with the PAYC has not been in contact with the PAYC committee. Last Mr. Dykes had heard they may have to go out for bids. They are also working to extend the lease with Jep's and Sharkey's. Under committee reports it was noted they were successful in securing funds of \$400,000 from the PAEDC to fund the building of Logan's Park. They will get the architect to start the process. They have not received the 10% retainage from FEMA for the marina project.

OLD BUSINESS – 1)About-Time needs new water pump and carbonators rebuilt. Cost will be \$500 and \$200 if the carburetor needs to be rebuilt.

SEA SCOUTS - Carry Over from General Meeting


