Mark got carried away with lubrication of the gate which caused it to jam. We had to reset the stops. The gate should now be in good working order...

Paul Vera, Russ Myers, Jessie Aranda and Richard Hughes worked on the Junior Sailing equipment and "About Time". The sail loft and storage area looks really good for now. "About Time" received a good wash as well.

Pat O'Quinn, Ed Wiltz, and Eric Phelan worked on getting water sourced to the screen house. Several of us showed up at the screen house after we got our other tasks done. The scene there was a bit comical. A 20 foot trench was dug exposing the pipeline. The new line was connected to the exposed pipe and we got water to the flush lines but not to the screen house. We dug another six feet. Did some more cutting and fitting. We glued the pipes together and turned on the water a bit too soon... We then cleaned up the mess and re-glued the connections. We waited a bit longer and the connection held.

The men's toilet was also repaired with a new seat and a new handle. Now if we could only get it to quit rocking... That evening we had the Moonlight race. Karen and I took out Sea Dreams (a 39' Westerly Sealord with a 5' 6' draft) and raced with the cruisers. We got over the starting line first for the cruisers and third overall. The winds started light and everyone began to pass us up. It did not look good, and then the winds started to build. By the time we made it to the mark we had passed up all the cruisers except Jessie Aranda.

When we were headed for the mark, Jessie was about four to five boat lengths ahead of us. There was just enough room between Jessie and the mark to get through so I saw our opportunity and took it.

At this point I should tell you that the mark was the oil rig. First Karen (and Jessie) were worried about us T-boning Camisa (Jessie's sailboat), then Karen was having a heart attack about how close we were to the oil rig. I was happy I missed T-boning Camisa but most happy about finally passing Jessie up in the race. I was instructed by Karen not to talk to her for the rest of the race. It was a good night.

That was the fun stuff and now for the not so fun. The current slip assignments are not adequate for the needs of all of our members. We have members who are in the need of boat slips where they are able to access their boat. The hurricane and rate of repair by the Island commission is leaving us in a terrible bind. We have no more large slips available. We do have a few smaller slips available. We also have boats that are currently unusable for sailing and motoring and are taking up good working slips.

The bottom line is that we are going to have to move some boats around so that we can accommodate the membership as a whole. For those of you who have boats in good working order we may have to move your boat to another smaller (width and/or length) into a working slip. This will allow us to place a larger functioning boat into a working slip so their owner may have access to it. I understand these moves may not be wanted by some but we would appreciate your cooperation so that we can provide everyone a working slip.

We are working as we can with the commission to get these docks repaired. Progress has been slow.

The weather is getting warmer every day. Spring is here. I hope to see you out there.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

The finance committee has finalized a budget proposal. They reported that the proposed budget is based on 165 members @ \$180.00 a year, which will be \$29,700 for 2007. They proposed to raise the annual membership dues from \$16.00 to \$20.83 a month, or from \$180 a year to \$250 a year, which would increase the budget to \$39,600. Dues have not been raised in over eight years. The raise is needed to offset the increase in the cost of living. Johnny Otto raised concerns that cutting the social and junior sailing budgets could actually hurt the growth of the club. The finance committee replied that if we have an increase in membership that some budgets might be readdressed. The proposed increase if passed will take effect on July 1, 2007.

The Board passed the proposed budget. Ballots are to be included in April's Mainsheet. Also there will be ballots for the proposed increase in membership dues.
